

RUDOLPH KHATCHATRIAN

Born in Yerevan, the capital of the Armenian Republic of the U.S.S.R, in 1937, RUDOLPH KHATCHATRIAN, mostly self-taught, painted at the age of 14 with delicate interpretation of textures of an Albrecht Dürer (Interior of his native home - 1951). From the age of 17, his portraiture suggested Leonardo da Vinci, and at the age of 18, in his series "Houses at Kadjaran, the Old Yerevan" 1955, his works hold both the poetry of a Jean-Baptiste Corot and the mystical aura of a Gustave Courbet.

However, RUDOLPH KHATCHATRIAN's talent appears totally unique in its MAGICAL quality. A deeply religious man, he feels his hand is "guided": confronted with his extraordinary penetrating portraiture, one CANNOT disbelieve this! When RUDOLPH's intense gaze mesmerizes a sitter, his pencil will denude the soul of the model and within minutes perform the most entrancingly profound psycho-analysis, in a sensitively rendered portrait. Beware, Ladies and Gentlemen of this Freudian Father Confessor, this 20th century Leonardo, when you meet him on the 27th November! Be also prepared to spend an evening of ENCHANTMENT with RUDOLPH KHATCHATRIAN's works on show.

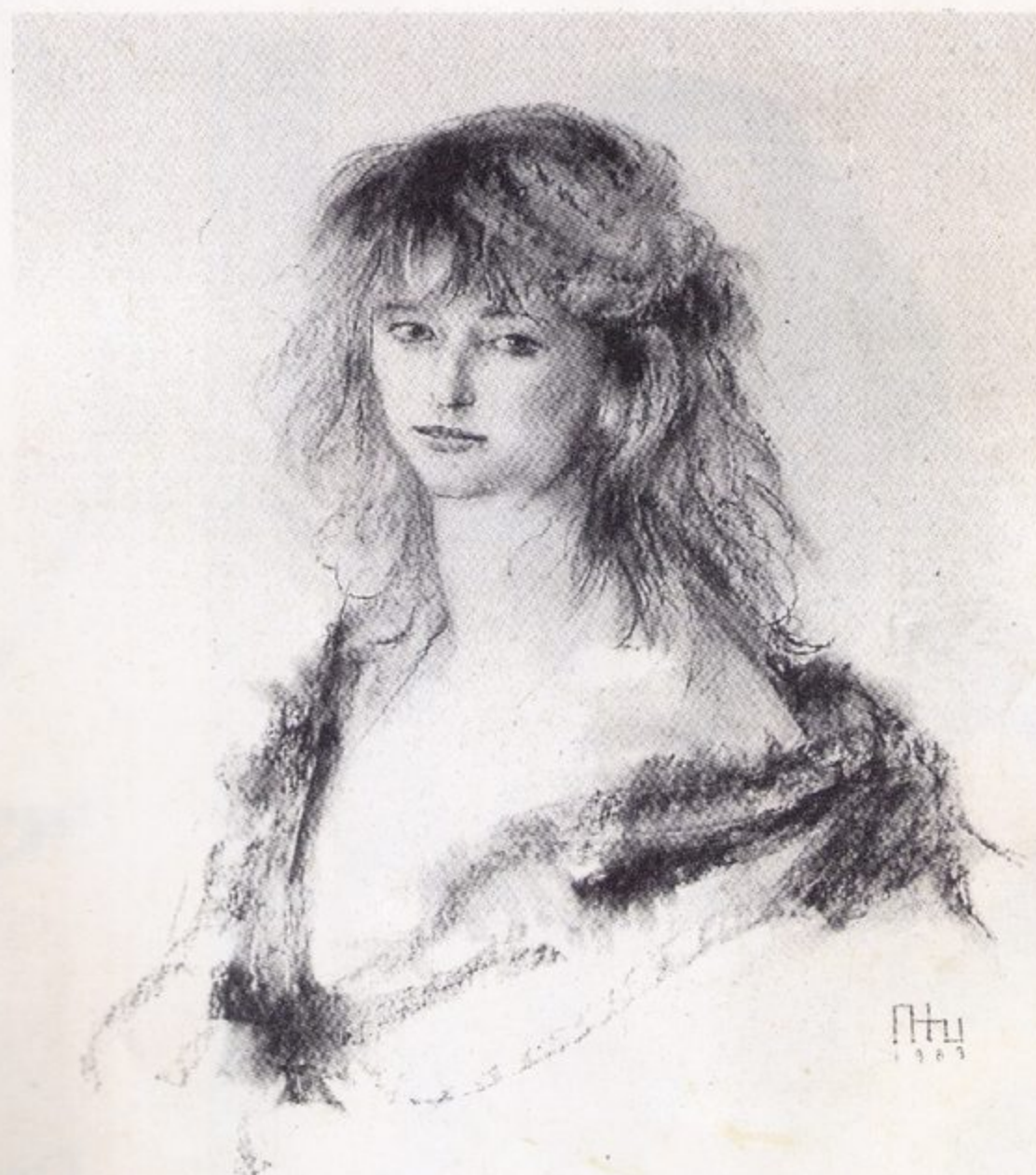
