- 1937 Born in Yerevan
From the age of fifteen, studied under Yervant Kochar, the Armenian sculptor, who left a lasting influence on the artist's subsequent artistic development and philosophy.
- 1959 7th International Young Artists' Competition, Vienna. Prize winner.
- 1960 Member of Soviet Artists Union
- 1966 Mixed exhibition, National Museum, Prague
- 1969 Komitas portrait commission and 1st prize awarded by the Ministry of Culture, Armenian SSR
- 1970 'De l'Urartu à Nos Jours' The Louvre, Paris
- 1971 Established his studio in Moscow, where he exhibited in major museums and participated in All Union exhibitions
- 1977 Member of Artists Union ASSR
- 1984 Awarded 'Peoples' Artist of the ASSR'
